1. The entry numbers for the World Indoor Championships Daegu in March are the largest since the event commenced in 2004
2. Andrew Jamieson, M70 has been named the WMA 2016 Male Athlete of the Year for his triple gold success in the race walking events in Perth along with the two world records that he set during the year
3. Irene Obera W80 from the USA was named the WMA 2016 Female Athlete of the Year for her gold success in Perth and five world records

Serious Administration Stuff

At the last AMA AGM held in September 2016, a number of changes were made to the AMA Constitution. Most were common sense updates on practicalities.

However, there were several that will impact the direction our sport is heading. For example, how we work together with Athletics Australia and a practical application is the handling of a positive doping test when an athlete challenges the results and penalty.

There are also changes to how long a person can be on the Australian Masters Athletics Board. Previously there were no limits on the number of years a person could hold a position. This has now changed. Now a person can only be on the Board for a maximum of 16 years and a person cannot hold a specific executive position for more than 8 years. The non executive Board has also been reduced from six to four people and that will come into effect at this year's AGM in September. Finally, instead of every position being up for election every year, now only half the positions will be contested each year (two executive and the two non executive Board positions).

There are currently nine people on the Board so this will reduce to eight.

What does this Mean to You?

The reality is that throughout the member states and territories, more time has to be given to succession planning at both state and national level. More athletes need to be willing to step up and gain some experience in administration. More athletes under the age of 40, 50 and 60 need to put themselves forward so that the older administrators can be gradually replaced with younger people with a fresh approach and innovative idea.

Best wishes for your continued success in athletics at whatever level you are competing. For those heading to Daegu, enjoy your experience.

World Masters Indoor Track and Field Championships



The WMA Indoor Championships started in 2004 in Sindelfingen, Germany. Australia has been represented at each championship and this year in Daegu with 84 competitors we will have our largest team yet.

In 2008, our men's and women's relay teams set inaugural Athletics Australia open records for the 4x200m - this was brushed over by AA as a rarely run college and masters event. Needless to say it was pretty cool for our teams to be in the mainstream AA record book.

This year we have 84 team members - 42 women, 42 men; the first time we have had an even split. There are 44 team members who will be experiencing their first world masters indoor competition.

The events we contest are 60, 200, 400, 800, 1500, 3000, 3000 walk, 4x200, LJ, HJ, PV, SP, WT (all indoors) and cross country, half marathon, 10k walk, DT, JT, HT (all outdoors).
