

Australian Masters Winter Throws Championships 2023

We asked the founder of the Winter Throws Championships a couple of questions. Below is his response.

Yes, ACTMA, then ACTVAC, did have a very strong throwing group, both men and women. But that wasn't the impetus for starting the Winter Throwing Championships (WTC). It occurred to me that runners in particular were able to compete in a variety of events, summer and winter, while throwers only had the summer season. I devised the WTC to provide a stimulus for Masters throwers to keep training during the winter, with the championships being both an indication of how well they had trained during the winter and as a major lead into the summer T&F season.

There was excellent support from ACTVAC's committee for the concept and I approached Len Childs, then AAVAC President,who incidentally was a friend of mine, being a fellow Principal in the ACT public education system. Len said put it in writing from ACTVAC and send it to the national committee. They accepted the concept and the WTC was started.

My personal vision, right from the start, was to provide a full program of events that would encompass all the throws plus some innovations as the Championships grew. Initially we had some 40m sprints and standing triple jumps, but we phased them out and gradually introduced the 100lb and 56lb weights and Heavy Weight Pentathlon. I devised the HWP event and Bob Banens developed the scoring table.

Editor Kevin Ryall kjryall@gmail.com NSW continued the innovatory approach with the introduction of the One Arm Weight Throw. So innovation was an important precept.

Additionally we wanted to provide a program that the athletes felt they had some ownership of. We deliberately organised the three day event so that the athletes could act as officials, so that athletes could get together in off-event times to talk to each other, so that coaching could be provided to anyone seeking it, and to provide refreshments at as cheap a cost as possible,. And on the subject of cost, we waned entry fees to be kept to an absolute minimum. Cost can be a major disincentive to people travelling interstate, so we worked hard to minimise fees.

My vision remains the same, - to provide a high quality, friendly, low cost program of events for the throwing community, with each state holding the event looking for innovations that will enhance the athlete's experience.

There were many great performances in my 20 years as convenor. Ruth Frith immediately comes to mind. Competing in the 95 and 100 year categories she rewrote the record book, setting world and Australian records that were extraordinary. In particular she mangled the the Throws Pentathlon record scoring

upwards of 1500 points for some events.

Graeme Rose was a standout performer as well as a great bloke. For his size he was probably the best all round thrower Australian Veterans/Masters has produced. Hammer - high 40m; Shot - 13m; Discus - around 40m ; Javelin mid 50ms; Weight - around 20m. Other notables include ex Aussie international reps at open level, Karyn de Marco and Stuart Gyngell.

As to great characters there were/are many: the Jones family- Bob Karen and Warren. They would turn up year after year, not because they were going to rewrite record books, but because they loved the event. Keith James was another, total mischief! Graeme and Astrid Rose who always were the first visitors to arrive and the last to leave because they helped with the ground set up and take down. And Cindy Lee Abelbide, from the US, who left her competition to chase after a kangaroo that strayed onto the field. It was the first one she had seen. And legally blind Royce Foley, giving coaching advice to competitors. There are many more.

Unfortunately injuries and worn out joints have curtailed my achievements compared to years past, but not my enthusiasm and ambition. For me, at any age, and no matter what shape my body is in , it is always about, "What is the best I can do at this moment in time."

I still weight train 2-3 times per week throughout the year with some aerobics thrown in. My knees won't let me run anymore but the stepper and the stationary bike are good substitutes. After being in sport for over 70 years - athletics, swimming, AFL, Life Saving, Cricket and coaching - it is a way of life. And I am positive many others out there feel the same way.

A short history of the Winter Throws Chamipionships

PHILOSOPHY: From the first meeting of the 1996 committee it was stressed that the concept of a national veterans throwing event should embody distinct principles and values.

These were inclusivity, friendliness, participation, fairness, sportsmanship and socializing. In practice this was meant to result in a program provided at the lowest possible cost, where competition, while important, would be only one feature of the outcomes.

The organisers wanted an event where everyone would help run it, where competitors could receive coaching and helpful advice from each other, where competitors could always be in close proximity to each other, where, because the competitors were assisting in running the event, fairness and friendliness would be the basis of decision making, where competitors, no matter what their level of achievement or their level of athletic ability, would be welcome, and where competitors and their personal achievements could be recognised and celebrated.

For the first few years this consisted of two of the throws (hammer, discus) occurring on Day 1, the Throws (at that time Weight) Pentathlon on Day 2 and the final three individual throws (javelin, shot, weight) on day 3. W

From 2001 a new event was added to the program, the 100lb Weight Throw (the implement was half an elevator

counterweight at this time!). This event proved very popular with both men and women so the committee introduced the 56lb Weight AMA Winter Throwing Championships 1996-2015 Page 4 Throw as well and had both weights specially made as spheres.

Soon after, another event was added to the program. Ray Green devised the Heavy Weight Pentathlon, an event where the athlete throws five Heavy Weights, the age related weight and the two immediately above in weight and the two immediately below in weight with the throwing order being from lightest to heaviest. Scoring tables were initially

developed by Bob Banens with a new, updated version created by Stuart Reid some years later.

DISCOBOLUS: At the first meeting of the 1996 committee the suggestion was made to identify the event with

a significant logo. "Discobolus" was quickly accepted by the group as an outstanding representation for throwers.

Discobolus" is derived from the Greek "diskobolus" meaning discus thrower: diskos/discus and ballos/ to throw. The iconic image is from a famous Greek statue attributed Myron from about 450BC to representing an athlete throwing a discus. This representation, including the size of the discus relative to the size of the athlete's arm, is said to show the classic Greek style of discus throwing and was part of the modern Olympics from 1896 alongside normal discus throwing. It was discarded in the early 1900s as being too complex.

While the guiding principles for the Championships embraced inclusivity and egalitarianism it was recognised by the Committee at the conclusion of the 1996 Championships that trophies should be awarded to the Champion female and male athletes as judged by members of the committee.

These awards could take into account any or all of a number of achievement attributes including records at Championship, Australian and World levels; relativities to World/Australian Records; results in one event or a number of events and dominance of results in an age group.




